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

JC NERR in October

Hello volunteers! I hope you are enjoying October and finally some fall-like weather without too much humidity and rain!

The beginning of this month brought an end to our outdoor festivals for the season, but we had two beautiful, 'summer-y' days for them. The first weekend of this month we participated in the Cattus Island Nature Festival at Cattus Island County Park in Toms River. In addition to numerous environmentally related organizations with information tables, Cattus Island offered a whole host of activities, including nature walks, kayak tours, boat tours and seining. If you have never been to Cattus Island County Park, it is a beautiful place to visit with an environmental center, numerous walking trails and a butterfly garden.

The second festival we attended was Coast Day in Cape May sponsored by NJ Sea Grant. Another sunny (and hot!) day for a festival, this event took place on

the docks of the Lobster House Restaurant in Cape May. Similar to the Cattus Island Nature Festival, Coast Day is geared toward families and offers a variety of educational activities, including information booths, 'crab races', touch tanks, and learn-to-fish demonstrations. JC NERR was in the thick of it with a fish printing station. Fish printing is the art of painting a fish, a recently deceased fish or a rubber casting (in our case we use rubber as it is much less smelly and also longer lasting!), and transferring that imprint onto paper or a t-shirt. Both festivals are great environmentally and family oriented venues that take place annually.

Shore Bowl 2012

The 12th annual Shore Bowl Academic Competition will be held on March 3rd, 2012. This event is co-hosted by the JC NERR and the Institute of Marine and Coastal Sciences (IMCS) at Rutgers and takes place in New Brunswick on Rutgers' main campus.

The Shore Bowl is part of a larger nation-wide competition - the National Ocean Sciences Bowl (NOSB), which is sponsored by the Consortium for Ocean Leadership. The NOSB is a national academic competition for high school students on oceanographic and marine science topics that aims to broaden student awareness of scientific research, aid teachers in marine education, and to introduce students to ocean-related career options.

The NOSB includes 25 regional competitions, including the 'Shore Bowl', which services schools in NJ and eastern PA. Other local states' bowls include the 'Chesapeake Bay Bowl' in Delaware and Maryland and the 'Bay Scallop Bowl' in New York. Winners of each regional competition go on to compete in the NOSB Finals Competition and teams that earn 1st through 4th place win an award trip.

Volunteers are essential to the success of Shore Bowl and take on many roles, including - competition officials (rules judge, moderator, scientific judge, timekeeper, scorekeeper), room runner (no running required, but walking is!) and logistical set up/breakdown support.

All Shore Bowl volunteers attend a

training session to learn their specific job tasks and background information on the competition. Most first-time bowl volunteers are 'room runners' who help set-up competition rooms, deliver answer sheets to judges and deliver score documentation to staff.

Volunteering for this event can be a very exciting and rewarding experience working with young students who are enthusiastic about marine science! If you are interested in participating or would like to learn more please contact myself or Melanie. We know it is quite a ways away from March, but the planning process has started now, as the time does come up quickly!

Volunteer Drivers
