Rose and Captain Ken at the Field Station for providing the shells!




World Ocean's Day:

Latest on the Gulf

On April 20, 2010 an explosion occurred on the BP drilling rig, Deepwater Horizon, leaving 11 workers missing and presumed dead. The rig sank two days later and it is believed the explosion has led to what is now being considered the largest environmental disaster in our history.

The oil leak now spanning 160 surface miles keeps gushing thousands of barrels of oil a

day off the coast of Louisiana, with no clear sign of stopping. Now nearly 70 some odd days after the initial leak, it still remains to be seen when the leak will be closed. BP is continuing its technique of capturing and burning off surface oil, while NOAA and other institutions and universities such as Woods Hole and Rutgers help aid in tracking and controlling the spill.
