

programs have been in full swing. Our Fall Foliage tour at
Bass River State Forest was rained out in October, but we were able to head out there this month for a beautiful crisp November day. We also headed out to explore the beauty of Great Bay Boulevard and learn about the surrounding marshlands and wildlife, with a morning and afternoon van tour. Although the day turned out a bit cloudy and foggy, everyone enjoyed their time on the Tuckerton Peninsula.

Our November 9th Lunch n' Learn program at the Tuckerton Seaport on Little Egg Harbor's Five Fish Factories garnered a sell-out crowd this month! Due to an overwhelming response, we

have rescheduled this talk by Pete Stemmer, a historical researcher from the Bass River Historical Society. The talk will take place on November 30th from 2-3 pm at the Education



Center at the JC NERR. There will be no lunch for this talk, but there is no fee for the presentation.

Black Sea Bass Research Update

The Rutgers Marine Field Station (RUMFS) has been conducting research on black sea bass that many volunteers have been involved with over the past couple of months. This research is focusing on sex-change in black sea bass with the goal of being able to provide better biological information for commercial and recreational fisheries so they can be managed in the most sustainable fashion.

This study incorporates a tag and recapture program that many of our volunteers have been an integral part of by going out on party boats in order to help catch black sea bass for tagging and release.

The last party boat trip for this season took place on October 23rd and was a great success with 62 fish tagged and re-

leased! At the outset of the project the aim was to catch, tag and release 1500 fish. To

date, 1119 fish have been tagged and 150 have been recaptured! This would not have been possible without all of the volunteers who gave their time and efforts to help with our research! Thank you for all your hard work! The black sea bass project is slated to continue next year with plans to continue tagging fish.
